

"It was amazing to watch such a great family from Iowa come together and see an amazing up-and-coming trainer like Mitch Adkins do so well on such a great colt," said Kim Brandriet.

Good N Dandy Mac, a 2005 bay stallion out of Sassy Dandy Dee, owned by Dean and Marlys Adkins and shown by Mitch Adkins, won the Ten Grand Classic at the Nebraska Silver Classic. The team also won the 2-Year-Old Limited Open Western Pleasure at the Southern Belle Invitation. And, Lisa Adkins rode "Reggie" to a win in the 2-Year-Old Limited Non-Pro Western Pleasure at the Southern Belle as well. Good N Dandy Mac was also the Reserve 2-Year-Old Limited Western Pleasure Champion at the Reichert Celebration, NSBA Breeders Championship and NSBA World Show. He earned more than \$20,000 in just three shows and has total earnings topping \$40,000.

All Good N Plenty, a 2006 sorrel filly out of Slow Floatin Zippo, owned by Brian and Kim Brandriet, won the Nebraska Silver Classic Breeders Open Yearling Longe Line with Jet Thompson and the Non-Pro Longe Line with Brian Brandriet. She was also the Reserve Champion at the Reichert Celebration with Brandriet and the All-American Quarter Horse Congress with Thompson.

Heavenly Mac, a 2004 sorrel gelding out of Heavens Fantasy, owned by Cheryl Mullikin and shown by Wade Black, won the 3-Year-Old Intermediate Western Pleasure at the Southern Belle Invitation and was the Reserve Champion at the Tom Powers Futurity. "Alex" was also the earner of over \$26,000 in slot and stakes class money at the 2006 Reichert Celebration.

Macs Good N Plenty's first World Champion was crowned in 2005 when Mac In Time, a palomino gelding and his owner, Fred Johnson won the Amateur Western Pleasure at the Palomino World Championship Show in Tulsa, Oklahoma. What's even more noteworthy is that Mr. Johnson is legally blind. Mac In Time was also Reserve Champion in the Open Western Pleasure that year. Then, in 2007, Mac In Time returned to the Palomino World Championship Show to claim his fourth World Championship. Owned by Elizabeth Tauber of Beverly Hills, California, and shown by Bruce Walquist, "Trigger" was the Reserve World Champion in both the Senior Western Pleasure and the NSBA 4-Year-Old Western Pleasure.

These are just a few of the showcased Macs Good N Plenty babies that are out there winning. Brian and Kim would like to thank all of the customers, trainers and judges who have supported Mac and they are looking forward to another great show season this year.

"It was awesome to see all of 'Mac's' babies out there winning last year, but what's ahead is even more exciting," said Brian Brandriet.

The Brandriets are equally excited about the future of their junior stallion, Ty, a 2004 stallion by Macs Good N Plenty and out of Misstig Rebel.

"This young stallion is an unbelievable mover with so much grace and great hocks and to top that off he is extremely kind and gentle with almost perfect conformation," said Kim Brandriet. "It is easy to forget he is a stud because he is so easy to be around."

Ty's first foals arrived in 2007 and the Brandriets say they have many characteristics of both their father and grandfather.

"Mac is known for passing on his incredibly good mind and big, kind eyes. We were so happy to see that Ty's babies are exactly the same way," said The Brandriets.
